

Financial Update

Since the end of September, we have again been enjoying in-person services at St. George's. However, we can only accommodate a limited number of parishioners per service and many are still watching the services online. Although we do have a large number of parishioners using preauthorized giving, the reduced numbers attending services has resulted in reduced income for the church.

The Diocese, who administers our payroll, has applied and been approved for the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy (CEWS) in every

month that it has been offered and is planning on continuing to apply for these funds as long as they are offered. This benefit is not shown as a rebate, but rather a reduction in our salary expenses. As mentioned before, Workside is back and this, along with a few individuals who have started to rent the kitchen, also offsets some of our expenses.


Our year to date (January to October) income at \$247,212 is off by \$45,000 from last year and is off budget by \$118,000 mainly due to a decrease in identified givers. There was also a reduction in both the Lent, Easter and Harvest offerings that added to the decrease.

Our expenses of \$375,831 are slightly under both last year's and the budget, due to the CEWS and some other savings. However, our expenses over revenues continues to grow and our deficit is now over \$128,000. This is almost \$40,000 greater than the same time last year and over \$111,000 greater than what was budgeted for.

As a parish, we must continue to do what we can to help St. George's recover financially from COVID-19.
