unspiritual, devilish. For where there is envy and selfish ambition, there will also be disorder and wickedness of every kind. Niagara in Action

All are invited to join in the annual Niagara in Action, taking place on Saturday, September 25 from 9:00am – 12:30pm via Zoom. This year participants will have two options from which to choose:

- 1. **Mapping the Ground We Stand On** is a PWRDF tool to explore Indigenous presence and Settler arrival on the map of Turtle Island/Canada. The tool has been revised to work virtually, allowing for up to 20 participants to join the session. PWRDF-trained facilitators have been working with a diocesan team, including Archdeacon Val Kerr, to create a good online learning experience.
- 2. **Creating 2SLGBTQ+ Positive Space** training will be provided by Deirdre Pike, Justice and Outreach Program Consultant. This training looks at Creating 2SLGBTQ+ Positive Space from a personal, organizational and political perspective and increases awareness of the presence of both subtle and overt forms of heterosexism, cissexism, homophobia and transphobia. Participants will learn how to become allies, advocates and accomplices to the 2SLGBTQ+ community of communities. (This session is not limited in number of participants.)
